Coming in January!

CHS will host Meridian case workers in a new partnership with Meridian Health Services, starting in January. We are offering a collaborative approach to the infusion of behavioral health services, or skills building services within the school day. In the near future, Meridian Health Services will be reaching out to the families of some CHS students to determine how we can partner together the school, the family, and Meridian, to help their students be more successful at school. This partnership will focus on helping students improve emotional regulation within social settings; improve focus on school subjects by practicing prosocial skills within real time settings; improve grades, attendance, and engagement by developing new skills to use in all life settings; and improve emotional and social wellness by allowing students a new method of communication. Grant Awarded To FFA

The Connersville High School FFA was awarded a \$10,000 grant by Monsanto (America's Farmers Rural Education Grant). The money will be used for the creation of raised garden beds at local elementary schools. This will give young Fayette County students the opportunity to plant crops, water, weed, and raise the crop for a fall harvest!
